Requirements on delivery: Completed entry form, entry fees and exhibit - clearly named on the back with class number entered.

Exhibit Delivery Location & Time: Pavilion Friday 9th September 8am – 10am

Exhibit & Prize Collection Location & Time: Sunday 11th between 1pm & 3pm

Conditions of Entry:

- A separate Entry Form is required for each Section.
- It is the responsibility of the EXHIBITOR to place the Exhibit Ticket on their own entry and then give the entry to the STEWARD responsible for that particular Section.
- All flowers with the exception of those used in the Decorative Section to be grown by the Exhibitor. No artificial exhibits will be accepted.

Definitions

SPIKE: A spike or flowerhead is the complete group of flowers and buds above the last stem leaf. It should be displayed without laterals.

CUT: A cut is a portion of a plant with its laterals.

DISTINCT: The term "distinct" means different. If a schedule says "three roses distinct", then three separate varieties must be staged.

NOT NECESSARILY DISTINCT (NND): This means an exhibit need not necessarily consist of separate varieties.

BOWL: A bowl is a vessel of any material whose greatest diameter is equal to or greater than its height.

VASE: A vase is a vessel of any material whose greatest height is more than its width.

CONTAINER: A container is a vessel of any shape. It can be made of any material.

ANY EMBELLISHMENT: Where a schedule says "any embellishment", the exhibitor may use natural and/ or artificial embellishment.

NOVICE: A person who has never won a first prize with the type of exhibit they are staging.
