Definitions

Spike: A spike or flowerhead is the complete group of flowers and buds above the last stem leaf. It should be displayed without laterals

Cut: A cut is a portion of a plant with its laterals

Distinct: The term distinct means different. If a schedule says "three roses distinct" then three separate varieties must be staged.

NND- (Not necessary Distinct):This means an exhibit need not necessarily consist of separate varieties.

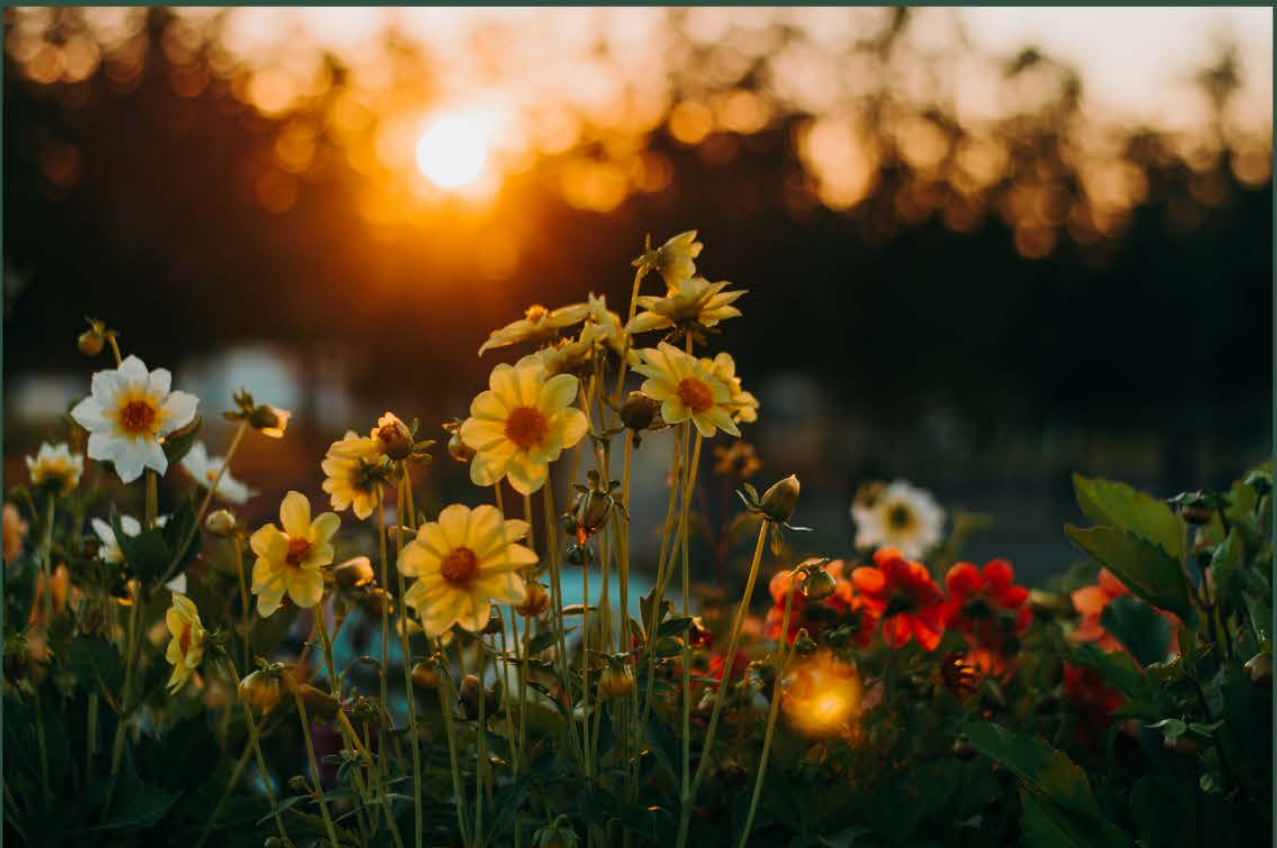
Bowl: A bowl is a vessel of any material whose greatest diameter is equal to or great than its height.

Vase: A vase is a vessel of any material whose greatest height is more than its width

Container: A container is a vessel of any shape. It can be of any material.

Any embellishment: where a schedule says "any embellishment", the exhibitor may use natural and/or artificial embellishment.

Novice: A person who has not one more than five (5) first prize with the type of exhibit they are staging.

2. One Lily
3. One Geranium
4. One Camellia
5. One Cut Iris
6. Three (3) pansies, to be shown in saucer (NND)
7. Three Ranunculi
8. One Jonquil
9. One Daffodil
10. Three Freesias
11. One Tulip
12. One bulb of any variety in flower not mentioned
13. One spike orchid
14. One flower not mentioned previously, one cut or spike
15. One cut of flowering shrub
16. One cut of blossom (not to exceed 60cm in length)
17. One cut of flowering native shrub or tree
18. Small post of lavender
19. One cut hellebore
20. One cut of flowering vine (not exceed 60cm in length)
21. One bunch of violets (small)
