**Entry Fee:** \$2 for the first entry then 50cents per additional entry this applies to each section.

**Requirements of Entry:** Completed entry form together with the entry fee and exhibit. Separate entry form for each section.

**Exhibit delivery:** Exhibits to be entered Friday 8<sup>th</sup> between 8am – 10am at the Nancy Gray OAM pavilion at the Showgrounds.

**Exhibit collection time:** Nancy Gray OAM Pavilion Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> after 2pm,

All exhibits will to be marked off on collection, prize money and trophies to be collected Sunday with exhibits from steward

**Conditions of Entry:**

- All flowers with the exception of those used in the Decorative section to be grown by the exhibitor.
- No artificial exhibits will be accepted unless stated

## Definitions

**Spike:** A spike or flowerhead is the complete group of flowers and buds above the last stem leaf. It should be displayed without laterals

**Cut:** A cut is a portion of a plant with its laterals

**Distinct:** The term distinct means different. If a schedule says “three roses distinct” then three separate varieties must be staged.

**NND-** (Not necessary Distinct): This means an exhibit need not necessarily consist of separate varieties.

**Bowl:** A bowl is a vessel of any material whose greatest diameter is equal to or great than its height.

**Vase:** A vase is a vessel of any material whose greatest height is more than its width

**Container:** A container is a vessel of any shape. It can be of any material.

**Any embellishment:** where a schedule says “any embellishment”, the exhibitor may use natural and/or artificial embellishment.

**Novice:** A person who has not one more than five (5) first prize with the type of exhibit they are staging.
